

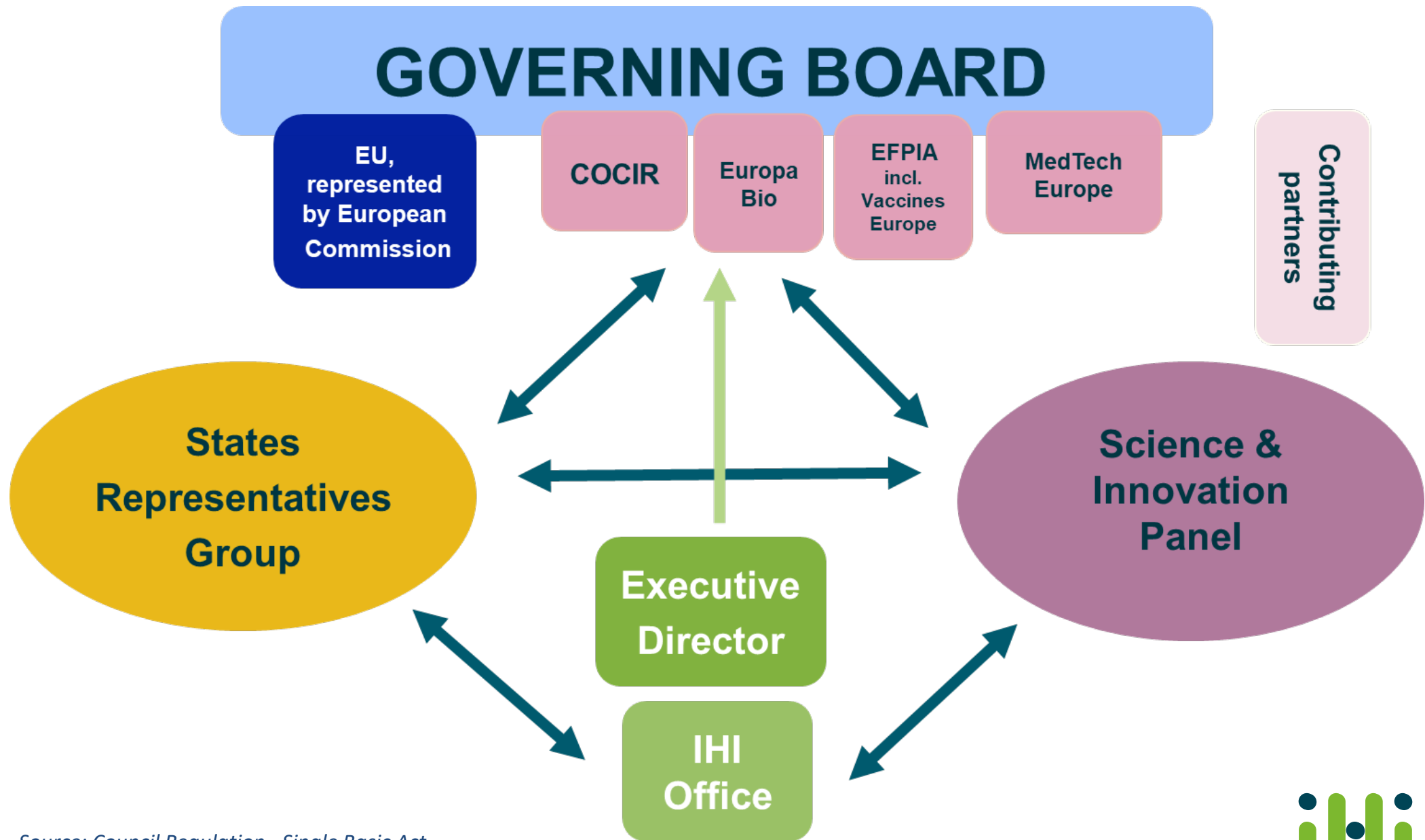

States Representatives Group (SRG)

The States Representatives Group (SRG) consists of representatives of the EU Member States and countries associated to Horizon Europe.

The group is consulted on a range of issues, including draft call topics. It also acts as a **vital link between IHI and relevant national and regional research and innovation programs and initiatives.**

States Representatives Group (SRG)

The SRG is consulted and invited to give an opinion on a range of issues, including:

- draft work programmes, including draft calls for proposals;
- links to Horizon Europe and other EU, national and regional initiatives;
- the involvement of different types of organisations in IHI projects, in particular small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs), start-ups and newcomers;
- actions taken on the dissemination and exploitation of results;
- updates to the Strategic Research and Innovation Agenda (SRIA).
- finally, the SRG can issue, on its own initiative, opinions, recommendations or proposals to the Governing Board or the Executive Director on technical, managerial and financial matters as well as on work programmes and other documents, in particular when those matters affect national or regional interests.

Science & Innovation Panel (SIP)

Why do we need the SIP?

IHI requires **multi-stakeholder input** to fulfil its objectives and ensure it addresses **unmet public health needs**:

- **Scientific & technological input** relevant to the scope of IHI.
- **Input from other stakeholders in the healthcare system** to ensure that its strategic design and activities address the needs of the health care systems and of the patients

Role of the SIP

The SIP will provide science-based advice to the Governing Board, on scientific and technological matters

- IHI's draft work programs, and in particular the draft call topics;
- updates to the SRIA;
- the planning of additional activities;
- the set-up of advisory groups focused on specific scientific priorities;
- synergies with other Horizon Europe activities, including other European partnerships, other EU and national programs.
